Hi. My name is Adronisha Frazier. I am a Biology

Instructor at Northshore. My professional career started off in an amusing way. I graduated from Southeastern Louisiana University (SLU) in December 2014 with a Master of Science in Biology. I was offered and accepted a part-time Biology Teacher position at SLU's Upward Bound Program on February 3. On February 4, I was offered and accepted a full-time position at the University of Houston-Downtown (UHD) as a Microbiology Laboratory Technician. I was so passionate about teaching my high school students that I would leave Houston every other Friday evening around 6:30pm with my daughter to drive to my parent's home in Tangipahoa Parish. I would wake up early Saturday mornings to teach for 8am. I enjoyed the experience so much that I inquired about teaching in UHD's Upward Bound Program in the Fall semester. I was temporarily teaching until I discovered I could not teach part-time while being employed full-time. This incident motivated me to pursue teaching as a full-time profession. So, I enrolled in Prairie View A&M University's Alternative Teacher Certification Program. I learned so many strategies and techniques I had been unaware as a teaching assistant in graduate school. After acquiring a Probationary Teaching Certificate, I began teaching high school chemistry at YES Prep Public Schools. But, my experiences had opened another door for me. I began researching doctoral programs in science education. I was interested in University of Houston-Clear Lake, Texas A&M University, Louisiana State University. I chose LSU because of the proximity to my family but the faculty accomplishments and projects are amazing. The faculty take great pride in their careers and I knew they would help me in my career. Since enrolling at LSU, I have completely restructured the way I teach and develop curricular content.
