## Memorandum of Understanding

BETWEEN

The College of Business of  
Louisianan State University of Alexandria (LSUA)



AND

The Division of Academics and Transfer Pathways of  
Northshore Technical and Community College (NTCC)



**2022-2023**

By this memorandum, the College of Business of Louisiana State University of Alexandria (LSUA) and the Division of Academics and Transfer Pathways of Northshore Technical and Community College (NTCC) agree to establish a comprehensive 2+2 program that will facilitate the transfer of 60 credit hours from NTCC's Associate of General Studies and Associate of Applied Science to LSUA's Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences.

## Agreement Outline

The agreement establishes the following two transfer pathways between LSUA and NTCC:

- 1) NTCC's Associate of General Studies to LSUA's Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences
- 2) NTCC's Associate of Applied Science to LSUA's Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences

### Pathway One

Students who have earned an **Associate of General Studies** from Northshore Technical and Community College (NTCC) and who meet LSUA's admission requirements will be admitted to LSUA and be enrolled in the College of Business's **Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences**.

Students who follow the recommendations of the curriculum guide; and who complete the curriculum of NTCC's Associate of General Studies; and who complete the remaining **60 hours** required by LSUA's baccalaureate program; and who meet all other baccalaureate degree requirements specified in the LSUA Catalog, including the attainment of an overall GPA of 2.0 and a grade of "C" or higher in English Composition I and II, will be eligible to receive LSUA's Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences.

### Pathway Two

Students who have earned an **Associate of Applied Science** from Northshore Technical and Community College (NTCC) and who meet LSUA's admission requirements will be admitted to LSUA and be enrolled in the College of Business's **Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences**.

Students who follow the recommendations of the curriculum guide; and who complete the curriculum of NTCC's Associate of Applied Science; and who complete the remaining **60 hours** required by LSUA's baccalaureate program; and who meet all other baccalaureate degree requirements specified in the LSUA Catalog, including the attainment of an overall GPA of 2.0 and a grade of "C" or higher in English Composition I and II, will be eligible to receive LSUA's Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences.

### General Guidelines

NTCC students will follow the requirements of the LSUA Catalog in force at the time they enter NTCC provided the catalog is not earlier than the 2020-2021 catalog and provided students do not interrupt their enrollment at NTCC.

If the requirements for any of the relevant curricula change, the institution that has made the change will notify the other institution so that the curriculum guide for the two+two program can be modified accordingly.

Some courses required by both NTCC and LSUA curricula may require prerequisites. Students should consult the NTCC and LSUA catalogs for specific information.

NTCC students who have taken subject examinations in the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or who have participated in the Advanced Placement Program of the College Board (AP) or who have superior ACT scores in English and/or MATH should have examination scores sent directly to Admissions. Official examination scores will then be sent to the Office of the Registrar for review and posting of credit on student's transcript if applicable


## Program Evaluation


LSUA will evaluate on a regular basis the performance of 2+2 students and other transfer students in upper level LSUA courses and compare their performance to that of continuing LSUA students. If the performance of 2+2 students is significantly lower than that of continuing LSUA students, faculty representatives from LSUA and NTCC will meet to enhance the alignment of courses from the two programs.


## Program Renewal


